What is the Extra Help program?

Extra Help, also known as Low Income Subsidy (LIS), is a special program for people with Medicare who meet income requirements. It lowers prescription drug and Part D costs.



Can you get Extra Help?

- ✓ You are unemployed or make less than \$22,590 per year (single) or \$30,660 per year (married couples living together)
- ✓ You have financial resources (like money in the bank, retirement accounts, stocks, or bonds) that are less than \$17,220 yearly (single) or \$34,360 yearly (married couple living together)



How much can the Extra Help program save you?

People who qualify for Extra Help will pay between \$0 and \$12.15 for all Part D covered drugs including brand names.
